TWO'S WINS HENRY MONSKY CHAPTER EXCELLENCE AWARD

Two's AZA was honored with the Henry Monsky Chapter Excellence Award at the BBYO International Convention, held from February 12-16, 2026, in Philadelphia.

The Henry Monsky Chapter Excellence Award is the most prestigious honor an AZA chapter can earn. It requires that the chapter represent top quality in all areas of chapter operations — a growing membership, diverse and rich programming, healthy chapter organization, and consistent contributions to, as well as participation in the initiatives and programs led by the International Order.

“This award means the world,” said Will Widman, Two's Aleph Godol. “The chapter has been growing continuously throughout my entire BBYO journey. It's an incredible achievement to be ranked among the top 10 chapters out of over 700 active chapters worldwide.”

Over the past year, Two's AZA has gained more than 20 new members, launched an award-winning BBYO Stand Up campaign, raised over \$10,000 during the third annual Marty Awards, recorded strong attendance at regional conventions, won the KC AZAA Basketball Cup, and maintained strong programming that incorporated all six folds of AZA.

According to BBYO Inc., the AZA chapters selected for this honor are “leaders of the global community of Alephs and exemplify the ideals set forth in the Seven Cardinal Principles” — Patriotism, Charity, Judaism, Fraternity, Purity, Conduct, and Filial Love.

“It is truly an honor to see Two's AZA recognized with the Henry Monsky Chapter Excellence Award, one of the most prestigious honors in our organization,” said David Wexler, Two's Advisor. “Being one of only 10 chapters worldwide to earn this award speaks to the dedication, growth, and excellence of our members and leaders.

As we celebrate this achievement, we also honor the rich history of our chapter, which will be celebrating its 102nd birthday this May. Our legacy is built on the foundations laid by visionaries like Nathan Mnookin and Philip Klutznick — founders and builders of this great movement whose contributions continue to inspire us today.”

In all, 12 Two's Alephs attended IC, in addition to Wexler.

In addition to the Henry Monsky Chapter Excellence Award, Two's AZA was one of five chapters worldwide to receive the BBYO Stand Up Gemilut Chasidim Chapter Award, which recognizes chapters around the world that work to better their community through civic action. This is the second consecutive year Two's has received this honor. In September, Two's launched its campaign, “Two's for Tomorrow,” focused on climate action and climate change. In September, Two's became the first chapter globally to join the Jewish Climate Leadership Coalition, a network of Jewish community organizations committed to addressing climate change. The coalition is part of Adamah, North America's largest Jewish environmental organization.

THE BROWN BROTHERS OF AZA #2

In the 1920s, brothers Henry and Jack Brown set a standard of excellence for AZA No. 2.

On May 9, 2026, Henry Brown and Jacob “Jack” Brown — sons of Meyer and Katie Brown — will be posthumously inducted into the Mnookin Memorial AZA #2 Hall of Fame at the Fourth Annual Marty Awards.

Henry Brown’s connection to AZA #2 begins at the very beginning. A charter member of the chapter in 1924, he was among the young Jewish leaders who helped establish what would become the second-oldest AZA chapter in the world. Inducted on June 21, 1924 — just weeks after the chapter received its official charter — Henry helped lay the foundation for a movement rooted in brotherhood, leadership and Jewish identity.

Born in Jersey City on April 5, 1907, he received his bachelor’s degree in chemistry from the University of Kansas in 1928. He went to the University of Michigan on a Rockefeller Teaching Fellowship, receiving his Ph.D. there in 1933 while working as an assistant professor.

A brilliant chemist, he went on to become an internationally recognized leader in electrochemistry.

His innovations in chrome and nickel plating transformed industries, from automotive manufacturing to wartime production. He even contributed to the Manhattan Project during World War II as a research chemist, developing porous nickel screens for separating atomic particles. Holding more than 90 U.S. patents, Henry’s work quite literally helped the modern world shine.



According to *The New York Times*, Brown “helped make the American Dream a gleaming reality by finding new ways of keeping chromium plate bright and shiny.”

Henry Brown graduated from Manual High School in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1924 — part of the same class as Philip Klutznick.

A dynamic and accomplished AZA leader, Jack served as Aleph Godol (president) for two terms in 1928, and distinguished himself not only locally, but on the international stage. In 1928, he earned second place in the International AZA Oratory Contest, showcasing his intellect and passion. The following year, he won the District Oratory Contest. He also competed at the highest levels in debate, reaching the finals of the National AZA Debate Contest in 1927.

That commitment carried into Jack’s distinguished professional and civic life. A founding partner of a prominent Kansas City law firm, he became a respected attorney known for integrity, fairness, and dedication. Beyond his legal career, Jack was a central figure in the Jewish community, helping to found the Jewish Federation of Greater Kansas City and the Jewish Community Foundation, and playing a leading role in the local Zionist movement. Known for his humility and generosity, he gave not only of his resources, but of his heart.

Henry and Jack represent the very foundation of what Two’s AZA has stood for over the past century — leadership, service, innovation, and a deep commitment to making the world better. They helped create a standard of excellence that has endured for generations and continues to inspire everything we do today.”

This year's program holds special significance as we celebrate the chapter's 102nd birthday. The chapter officially received its charter on May 10, 1924.

"Hosted at the JCC for the third year, we hope to continue to use this event to highlight the incredible accomplishments of Alephs, BBGs, programs and advisors from across Kansas City Council while providing a memorable, classy and entertaining night as ever," said Two's Aleph Sopher Micah Kramer.

"In recent years, the Marty Awards have cemented themselves as a cornerstone element of both the Two's and broader Kansas City BBYO calendar. The awards show has attracted more members year on year every year since its inception for a reason: people who attend love the night so much they come back again and every year we attract new folk from across Kansas City and beyond."

Some notable events in previous renditions have been celebrating our chapter's 100th anniversary to having the daughter of BBYO's first ever advisor in attendance.

"Having attended all three previous Marty's Awards, I have seen it grow into something truly amazing," said Two's AZA President Will Widman. "This year's show will feature a variety of activities designed to make the evening fun and entertaining for everyone."

HISTORIC YEAR FOR TWO'S

Two's AZA celebrated an exceptional year of athletic achievement.

Senior Eli Nathan finished as the runner-up at the Kansas 6A State Bowling Championship, missing the top spot by just five pins, and earned first-team All-State honors. On April 28, he captured first place at the Top 8 U18 2027 Youth Scratch Championship Tournament. Over the course of his career, he has recorded three perfect games, a rare and remarkable feat.

Nathan will continue his academic and athletic career at the University of Nebraska, where he plans to compete in bowling.

On the basketball court, Thomas Burns played a key role in a historic season for the Shawnee Mission South Raiders. The team finished 26-2 and earned a runner-up finish in the Kansas 6A State Championship, falling to Olathe North in the title game. The Raiders set a school record for wins and held the No. 1 ranking in Kansas for 17 consecutive weeks.

Burns, a 6-foot starting guard, averaged 9 points, 3.5 rebounds, and 4 assists per game. He was recognized as an All-Sunflower League Honorable Mention selection.

Thomas' younger brother, Andrew Burns, led Shawnee Mission South's JV team to an undefeated season.

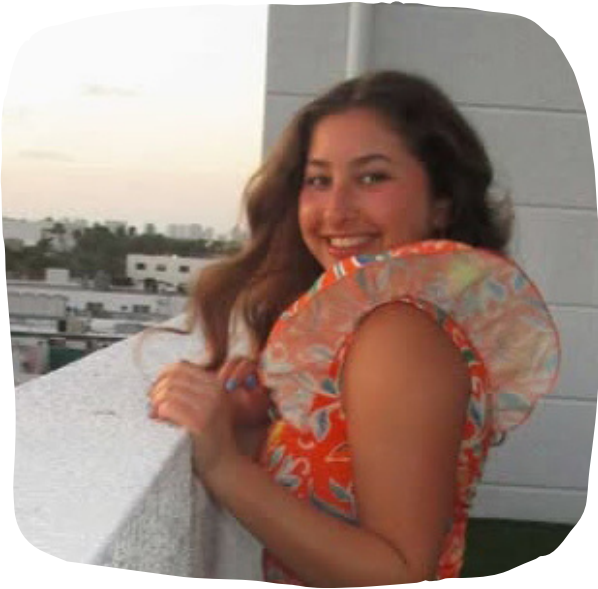

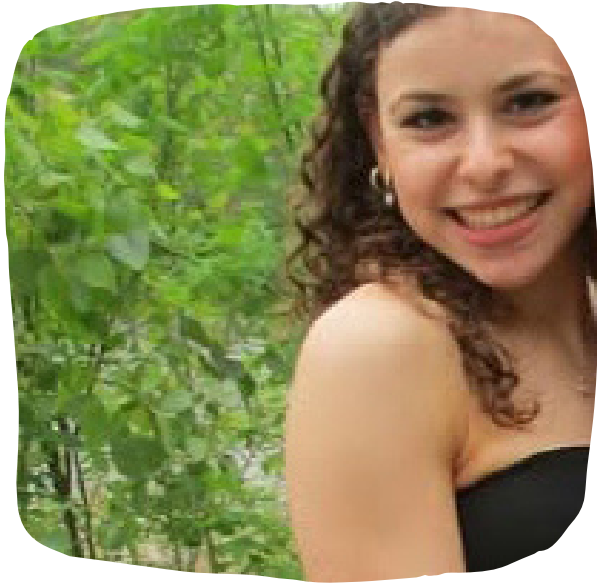
